Access:

From Republic Travel 2.5 miles north on Highway 20/21. Turn left at the junction of 20 and 21 north. Travel 12.4 miles. Turn right on Boulder Deer Creek Rd. Travel .34 miles. Turn right on Long Alec Rd #2040. Travel 10 miles to Forest Service Rd 700 continue ahead 2 miles to trailhead. No fees or facilities.



History:

Long Alec was a tall Indian who owned a store in Curlew. He was also the defacto sheriff for the area. Curlew was the junction where Tecumseh Sherman and his boundary negotiating party came down off the Kettle Crest in 1883 on their way to the Okanogan. by way of what is now Boulder-Deer Creek Pass then called Deadman Creek.

Cautions:

Treat surface water before drinking. Prepare for all weather. Watch out for large animals. No facilities and limited parking.



Description:

This short trail was once motorized. It is often used to pick up skiers who start out from the Boulder Pass trailhead to the Kettle Crest Trail. It intersects Upper Butte Road (now closed) before reaching the Kettle Crest Trail at a point 3.6 miles south of the Boulder Pass trailhead. Upper Butte Road and the Kettle Crest Trail form a loop back to Boulder Pass, which is also popular.
