

### Access:

From Republic From Republic drive north on Hwy 20/21 2.54 miles. Turn left on Hwy 21 and drive 14.1 miles. Turn right on Aeneas Creek Rd. Travel 4.2 miles to Tonasket Mt Rd, USFS # 2160. Travel 6 more miles to the Profanity Peak Trailhead. There is sufficient room to park but there are no facilities at the trailhead.

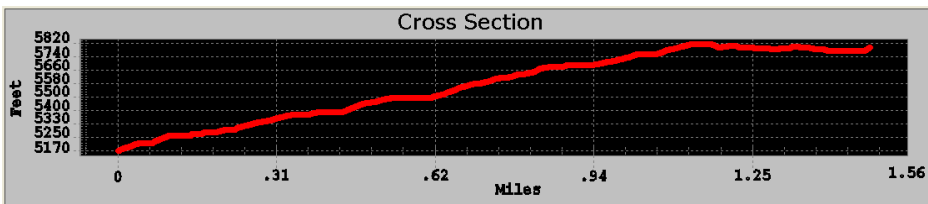

**History:** The road to Profanity Peak Trail goes around Tonasket Mountain. Like the town of Tonasket in the Okanogan Valley, this mountain was named after Chief Tonasket. He moved his tribe up to the Curlew area around 1885 to get away from miners and White settlers in the Okanogan and to have more forage for the tribe's livestock. He later opened a store and a racetrack at Curlew.

### Cautions:

Treat surface water before drinking. Prepare for all weather. Watch out for large animals. No facilities and limited parking.

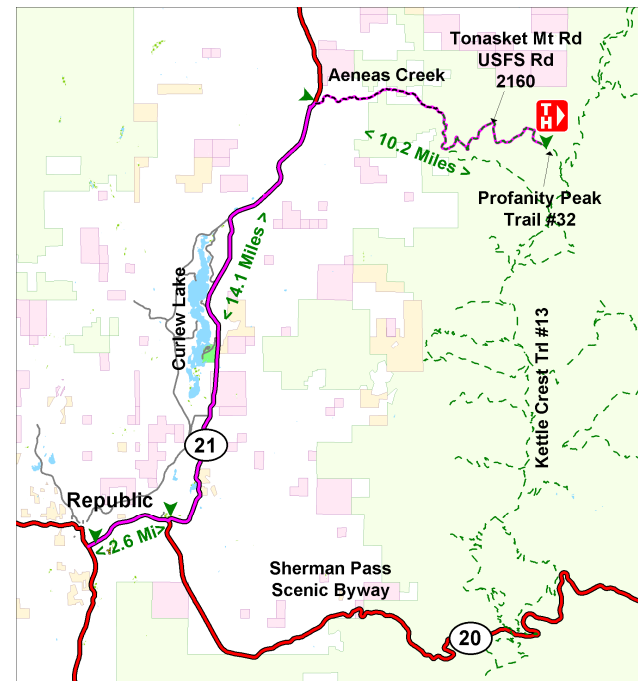


## Profanity Peak Trail #32

### Description:

This is a short trail with a gentle climb to the Kettle Crest Trail. There was a forest fire on Tonasket Mountain several years ago but the highlands near the crest were spared and offer open stands of virgin forest with grassy meadows between them. Large wildlife: bears, moose and elk live in these forests. Be aware of your surroundings and don't try to approach animals.
