Access: From Republic, take State Highway 20 east 17 miles to the Kettle Crest Trail parking lot on the left, or from the Kettle Falls Information Center travel 26 miles west to the trailhead parking lot at the top of Sherman Pass. The trail is across the highway from the parking lot. To reach the south end of the trail travel down Hwy 20 east to South Fork Sherman Creek Rd. Turn right and travel 5.8 miles to FS Rd #2014, Barnaby Butte Rd. Turn right and travel 1/3 mile to the junction of Barnaby Butte and Barnaby Creek Rd. Barnaby Trail #70 is ahead 2.3 miles on Barnaby Butte Rd. Or turn left and travel 3.8 miles to the junction with White Mt Rd #250. Turn right and travel 4.4 miles to the south end of the Kettle Crest Trail.



History: Although the pass is named after General Tecumseh Sherman who crossed the Kettle Range in 1883, Sherman actually crossed on what is now the Boulder Creek Road. Native coming-of-age ceremonies left hundreds of cairns on the mountain tops over that last 10,000 years.



Description: This trail climbs from 5450 ft Sherman Pass to the 6500 ft level on the side of Sherman Peak. It meets Snow Peak Trail #10, Edds Mt. Trail #3, Barnaby Buttes Trail #7 and Barnaby Buttes Trail #70. It climbs to the 6750 ft level of White Mountain and ends at the 5200 ft level of Onion Ridge 13.38 miles to the south. All along the way there are views of the 1988 White Mountain Fire complex to the west and Lake Roosevelt to the east.
